

## Android x86 installer setup for windows

You can install Android as a virtual machine in Windows 10. Here's how to install Android on your pc step by step. To install Android as a virtual machine in Windows from Oracle VirtualBox: Download VirtualBox for Windows and install it on your computer. Download Android x86 for Windows. Open the virtualbox and select New on the top taskbar. Give your virtual machine a name, select Linux as the type, select other Linux (64-bit) or other Linux (32-bit) for the version, and then select Next. Select the amount of RAM you want to assign to the virtual machine, and then choose Next. The recommended minimum is 1GB. The amount of memory you can use is only when the VM is running. Choose Create virtual hard disk now and then choose Create. Select VDI and choose Next. Select Dynamically Assigned or Fixed Size, and then choose Next. A fixed size is a better solution because computers typically have more disk space than memory and computing power. Select the amount of space you want to allocate to the virtual hard disk, and then choose Create. The amount of space allocated to Android determines how much space you need to install apps, so the more you can save, the better. Select Start on the VirtualBox taskbar. This is the point where you need to select the Android x86 ISO file that you downloaded earlier. Select the folder next to blank. Choose Add. Select an Android drive image and choose Open. Choose Choose. Select start. When the Android live boot screen appears, select Install Android x86 on your hard drive. Select Create/modify partitions, and then select OK. Select No when asked if you want to use GPT. Choose New. Select Basic. Leave the size as the default and press Enter on your keyboard. Select Startup. Choose Save. Enter Yes to create a partition. Select Close after you create the partition. Select sda1 as the partition to install. Select ext4 as the file type. Select Yes to format the drive. Select Yes when asked if you want to install the GRUB bootloader. Select whether to install the directory as read and write. Select Devices &gt; Optical Drives &gt; Remove Disk from the VirtualBox toolbar. Select Restart and OK. When the Android boot menu appears, select the first option to reach the Android setup screen. Then you will be taken to the screen configured for android. They should look familiar if you have an Android smartphone or tablet. There are minimum hardware requirements for Windows 10 to run on a laptop or desktop. You will need a 1 GHz processor or faster, 2 GB of RAM and at least 20 GB of hard disk space. You can check the processor and RAM by pressing the Start menu and right-clicking the computer to the right of the menu. Select properties, and then check the display of the information. To confirm how much space you have, tap the Start menu and click your computer, and then under Local Drive, you'll be able to see how much free space you have. On your PC, visit the dedicated Windows 10 upgrade page and scroll down to create Windows 10 installation media. Now tap the download tool and choose Run. When the operating system is ready to install, you'll see a summary of what you've chosen and what will be stored by the upgrade. Press Change What to keep if you want to switch between storing personal files and apps, storing only personal files, or keeping anything while upgrading. You need to save and close all open applications and files running, and then press Install. It is worth noting that installing Windows 10 will take a while and the computer will restart several times, whatever you do, do not turn off the computer. Then, the version of Windows should start its own normal installation process.
